# Our work from the beginning of full-scale war

From the very beginning of the Russian invasion we understood that our primary challenge was to adapt to the new reality in order to support Ukrainian teachers and students at most. We saw that the teachers' community really needs psychological and methodological support. And so we have developed a methodical manual on teaching English in wartime filled with practical advice on how to recognize signs of stress and how to deal with it further on. We keep providing psychological training, workshops and carry on with educational programs for teachers, children and youth. We are proud of being able to make a significant contribution to the motivation of teachers and students, and give them support. Providing the necessary tools in order to make the education process at least a bit more easy and comforting.

At the end of the year, we conducted research that proved the right choice of our strategy — it showed that **54%** of teachers are experiencing professional burnout, **75%** of students show signs of stress. In Ukraine there are so many education specialists and schoolchildren who need help themselves. We worked with many teachers, school psychologists and principals this year. **852** schools joined our psychological support programs. More than **2,000** educators attended our training. The total number of young people (children/teens/youth between 10-31 y.o.), whose teachers we had previously trained, and who were able to get qualified support amounted to **136,300 students**.

Speaking of children, we realized that we also had to provide them with skills that would help them to study in the current situation, as well as knowledge and soft skills that would be in demand in the modern world. That's why we continued to make our educational camps. We taught children creativity, leadership, critical thinking, stress resistance, etc.

The main focus of the program was to engage children in doing artwork to help them cope with stress and anxiety. Artists from Ukraine and abroad joined up the programme to help the children master creative techniques in various spheres of life. Participation in conversational clubs with foreign language volunteers also contributed to the task above. Volunteers reported that children were eager to talk about Ukraine and the current situation they had been going through. The language barrier became less important than the desire to tell the world their stories.

PROGRAM FOR CHERNIVTSI AND ZAKARPATTIA REGION TEACHERS AND STUDENTS HAVING ROMANIAN AND HUNGARIAN SPEAKING CLASSES.

The program focused on in-depth study of the Ukrainian language by Romanian and Hungarian speaking students in Chernivtsi and Zakarpattia regions.

The most significant project achievement is that the students-campers became peer-teachers for their classmates during the camp activities and after the camp ended. They instructed their friends how to use interactive digital tools for learning issues and in everyday life. They all resulted in using Ukrainian language more frequently in their daily life.

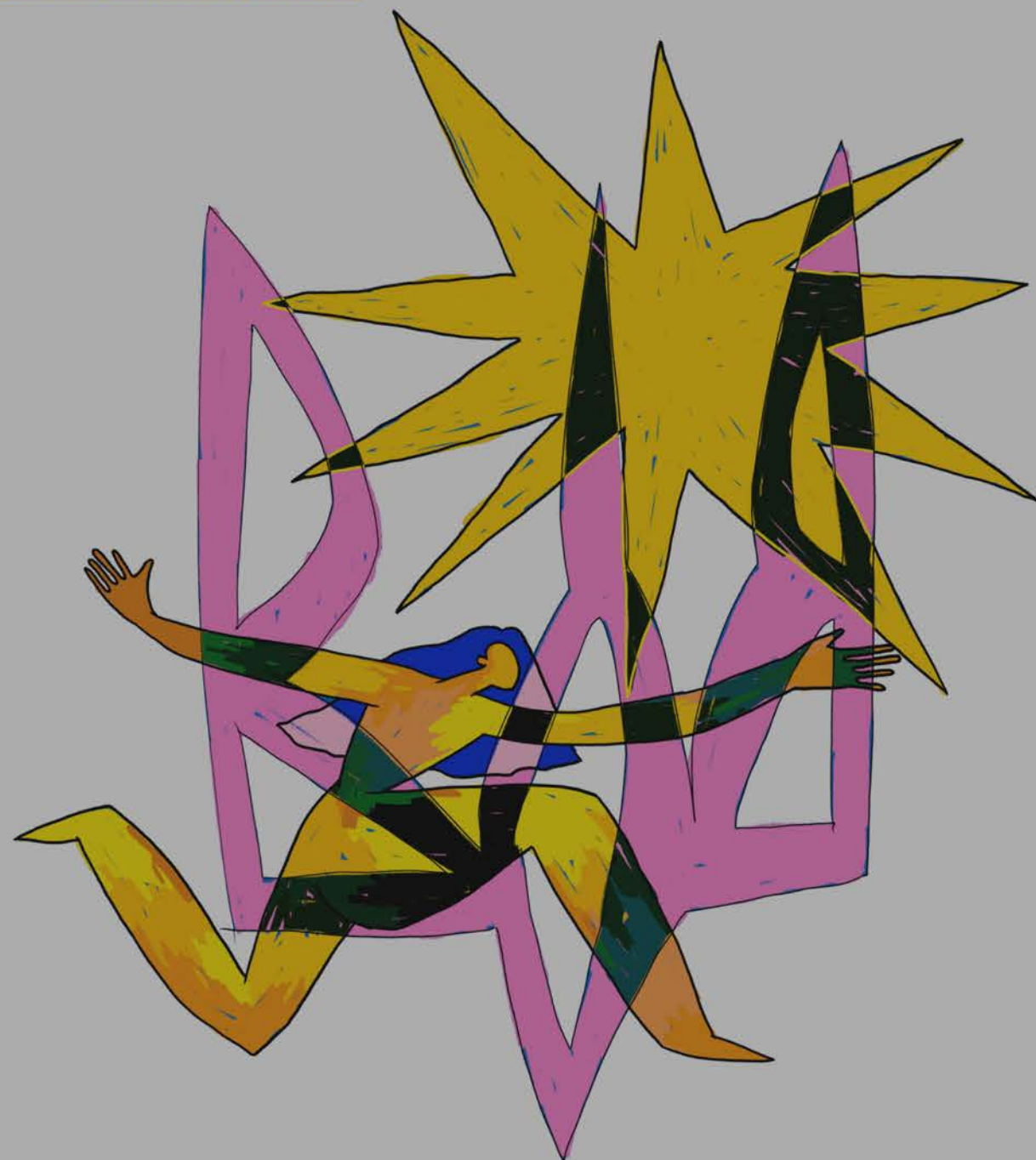

# Manifesto of Changes

More than 1,000 young people aged 15-18 from all over Ukraine and from the countries that granted them temporary shelter, gathered together online to form their own vision of the future of Ukraine based on building back better principles.

These students, together with 58 Ukrainian and foreign volunteers from 14 countries, worked on the creation of the Manifesto of Changes of Ukrainian Youth, which described the future of Ukraine and the participation of teenagers in its reconstruction.

In their Manifesto they've described their vision of the future of Ukraine, their participation in the country's transformation and current steps they take for the victory to come.





# Teachers in 2022

After the beginning of the full-scale war it was important for us to support teachers in their work. Therefore together with Kyiv-Mohyla center of psychological and sociological rehabilitation we started to do training for teachers in order to help them cope with stress and adapt to teaching to the new reality.

We calculated the estimated number of children taught by the teachers who attended the psychological support training in 2022 - it is approximately **136 301 persons**.

## PROFESSIONAL BURNOUT



## Research

From November 25 to December 22, 2022, GoGlobal conducted a survey among Ukrainian secondary school teachers and principals. We focused as well on the problems of internal adaptation resettled students and necessary help to teachers, changes in the student's profile, professional burnout of educators and their need for psychological help.

We wanted to understand the essence of the deep moods of students and teachers, their needs, to have a real picture during the war. And, of course, after that, give educators effective mechanisms and tools to support them and their students.

# 75% STUDENTS SHOW SIGNS OF STRESS



Our research shows that **80%** of the audience have noticed an increase in the teachers workload. **54%** experienced a professional burnout. In addition, **46%** of respondents identified psychological support as the No.1 need for their own school. This kind of support should go hand in hand with learning how to act in extreme situations, manage one's own stress and help children in different situations.

**75%** of students show different signs of stress.

# Media coverage

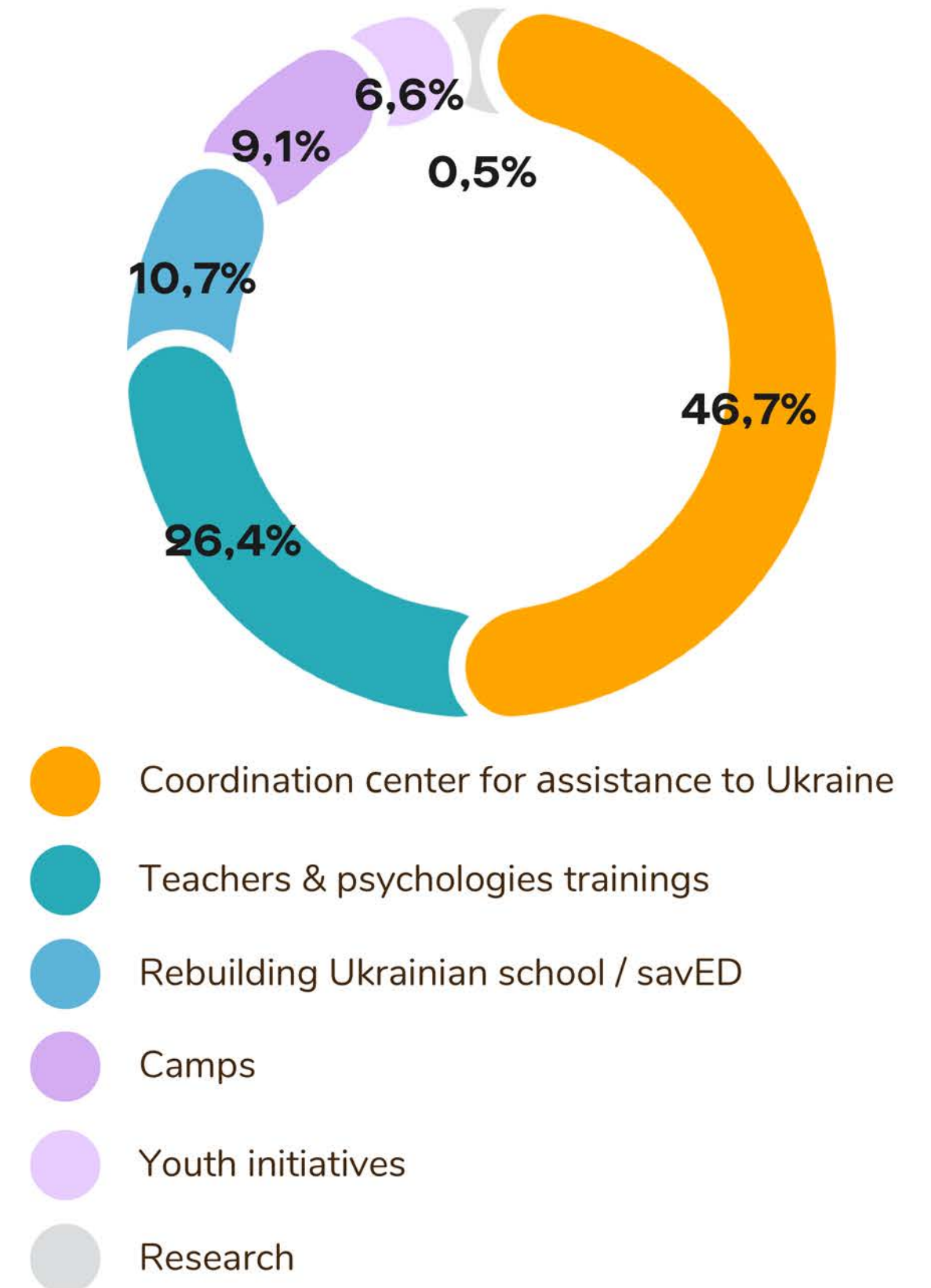
